Equipment: Easels are available at the studio.
A pochade box with finished palette, camp stool, or folding chair works well. You could sit and have your painting in the lid of a paint box resting in your lap. A bungee cord is handy to help secure the box on your lap.

Tri-pod field easel like Winsor \& Newton Bristol Easel - about \$60 (I have 2 to lend) works well and a board about $12 \times 16$ inches to hold your canvas on the easel. A multipocket tote can be used to carry all equipment instead of a paint box.

Note: If you want to get fancier than the equipment listed above: for field easels, the Julian French easel half box is fine or for pochade boxes the MABEF M/101 and M/103 (inexpensive). Guerrilla Painter has a great $9 \times 12$ " pochade box and Cigar Box. See it at: www.judsonpleinair.com.

A wide brim hat is good for blocking bright light.
Spring clamps large enough to clamp canvas or panel to easels are handy in breezy weather.
Tick and insect repellant - Deep Woods Off (green can) works great.
It is advisable to wear pants and shoes with socks and to spray them with tick repellant.
