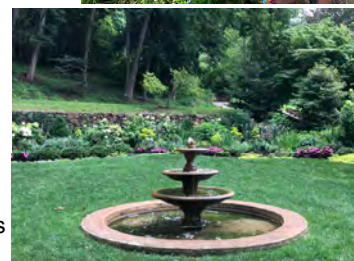

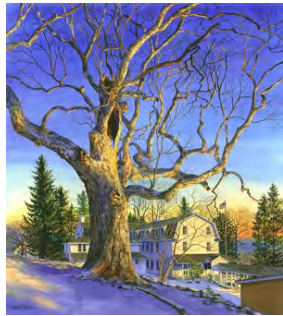

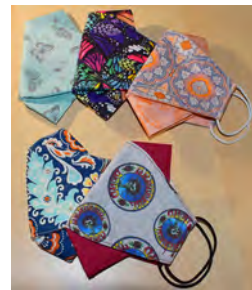

Dolphin was honored as the **Historic Yellow Springs 2019 Volunteer-of-the-Year** having volunteered at the Chester Springs Studio for many years. Volunteers are critical to the vitality of HYS, and Dolphin exemplified that spirit of giving. Volunteer Coordinator Kathy McGarry said that she volunteered at many HYS events: exhibitions and sales, pottery sales, the art show, fine arts, and crafts shows, Celebrating Clay and more.
